## DESCRIPTION

A whiteboard can provide a useful memory aid for the home.

They are available in a range of sizes and also with a magnetic finish for attaching notes etc with magnets.

Whiteboards require special markers that can be easily wiped off.

Whiteboards can be mounted on the wall, on fridges or can be stood on a table or sideboard.

### **APPLICATIONS**

Whiteboards should be placed in a prominent visible position within easy sight of the person with dementia.

This simple method can be used to remind the person about important appointments, shopping lists, who will be visiting and at what time of day etc.

May work well with an orientation clock. (See 1.00)
