DESCRIPTION

These locks are invisible from the outside of the cabinet.

Once installed, the cabinet door can only be opened by placing a magnetic knob-like "key" on the outside face of the cabinet in just the right spot – then the door unlocks and opens freely. The key is to be stored safely in a remote location.

Suitable for people with progressing levels of cognitive impairment.

APPLICATIONS

People living with dementia at times will lack the capacity to carry out certain tasks and face the risk of coming into harm if given access to certain items. Invisible cabinet locks mean such items are not accessible and are a discrete way to lock cupboard doors and drawers.
