
Our wide range of dementia specialised support services includes respite, counselling, education and social programmes available to people living with dementia as well as their families and carers.



About the Carer Support Program

Alzheimer's WA recognises that supporting a person living with dementia can be challenging given the complex and changing nature of dementia. Sometimes people can also feel alone or isolated in their support role.

Our Carer Support Program provides carers with an opportunity to connect with others in a similar situation and share their ideas and experiences. Programs are facilitated by Carer Support team members with expert dementia knowledge, who can link you with the support and services you need throughout your caring journey.



How could the service help me?

You can join one of our monthly Carer Support Groups or access the five week Carer Support and Information Program which provides education and support.

- A source of ongoing social and emotional support
